Tips and tricks to travel with peace of mind



Here are 5 tips to apply before wrapping your suitcase and go abroad

1- Declare war to bedbugs

3- There are alternatives to money belts

4- Check for the Roaming options to your cell

To avoid unpleasant surprises and high phone bills after a trip abroad, disable the cellular data and use your phone only on Wifi mode. Also disable all applications using geolocation or automatic downloading of data, even for your email inbox. Make sure to download your messages only when you are sure to be connected to a WiFi network.

5- Keep a copy of your important documents in a safe place

Before leaving, made a copy of your passports and your itinerary and your credit card numbers and travel insurance policy that you will leave secure in an envelope with a family member or a friend. Also make a copy of those documents and email them to your attention. This way, if you ever lose your luggages, you will be able to advise your credit card companies and have your important documents reissued like your passport.
