Suitcase thing



If it ever happens that you can't find your luggage on the baggage carousel after your trip, would you be able to answer questions allowing employees of airways companies to try to find them?

To speed up things, here are a few tips:

- Before your departure, write your names and addresses inside your luggage.
- Then, with your cellular or camera, take a picture of each of your piece of luggage and of the logo representing the brand.
- At the time of registration, take a picture of the ticket as a proof of identification.

If ever, one of your luggage would be reported missing, all you would have to do is show up at the booth of the airline company and show them these pictures, which should greatly help to find them.

According to the statistics published by the International Society of Aeronautics Telecommunications, more than 30 million pieces of luggage have been lost in air transportation since 2010. Each day, some 90,000 luggage are lost, which means that on an average a passenger doesn't find his baggage on the carousel.
